What is the Kittredge Improvement Fund?

KIF is a community fund that collects a voluntary 1% fee on purchases to support local infrastructure improvements in Kittredge — sidewalks, crosswalk signals, and road safety. Funds are held and administered by the Evergreen Legacy Foundation (ELF) and directed entirely by our local KIF committee. Every dollar goes back into our community.

Common Questions

- **“What is this 1% charge?”** It’s a voluntary 1% contribution to the Kittredge Improvement Fund, which pays for local sidewalks, crosswalks, and safety improvements in Kittredge.
- **“Do I have to pay it?”** No — it’s completely voluntary. Just let us know and we’ll remove it right away, no questions asked.
- **“Where does the money go?”** 100% of the funds go toward Kittredge infrastructure improvements, chosen and overseen by our local KIF committee.
- **“Who runs this?”** KIF is run by a volunteer committee of Kittredge community members. Funds are professionally managed by the Evergreen Legacy Foundation, a Colorado nonprofit.
